

Dear Colleague,

I am seeking your help in my doctoral research. I am studying the factors that influence learning disabilities nurses working in non-learning disabilities specific services. Some learning disabilities nurses work in health or social care services that provide care to people other than those with learning disabilities. For example, these might include dementia services, children's hospices or generic mental health services. People with learning disabilities might access these services, but they may not be specifically designed for them. However, the number of RNLDs employed in the NHS in England has dramatically decreased since 2010, related to a drop in applicants to learning disabilities nursing programmes, course closures and an increase in the number of RNLDs reaching retirement age (House of Commons Health Select Committee, 2018; NHS Digital, 2021). This study seeks to explain how perceptions of professional identity influence the employment of learning disabilities nurses in non-learning disabilities specific settings.
