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Southdown

- Not-for-profit housing and support provider working across Sussex – wide range of clients and services
- Over 10,000 clients supported each year;
 950 staff
- 229 clients with a learning disability in supported living and residential care services (450 staff)



Our learning disability services

- Supporting people with lots of different needs and/or behaviours that can challenge
- Lots of our clients have epilepsy
- 18 clients are prescribed Buccal Midazolam (emergency medication for epilepsy)
- 2 clients are deaf/blind



The challenge

We want:



- to provide good, personalised support
- to be able to support people to live ordinary lives in their own home
- · to prevent people going into hospital
- to prevent people having costly, invasive treatments from strangers
- to be able to communicate with everyone we support



The challenge contd...

To do this, our staff need:

- good quality, affordable, relevant health care training
- Good quality deaf/blind training

So – what's the issue?





Issues with training

- Not enough training available
- Cost and quality varies a lot
- Only 2 organisations do deaf/blind training
- Lack of clarity & nervousness re Buccal Midazolam – leads to:
 - Confusing messages from trainers
 - Confusion about 'competency'



The solution(s)....

- East Sussex developing epilepsy training plan and guidance
- Need regional or national approach to health care training needs of social care staff



The solutions contd

2 Southdown HEKSS funded projects:

 Train the trainer medication administration and epilepsy awareness

Deaf/blind input to 2 services



Project 1: Train the trainer

- Medication administration train the trainer
- Epilepsy awareness and Buccal Midazolam administration - train the trainer
- Teaching qualification



Sustainable approach



Train the trainer contd

Evaluation:

- Feedback and evaluation from:
 - trainee trainers
 - trainer (including observation of trainees training)
 - Participants
 - clients
- Monitoring of medication errors



Project 2: Deaf/blind

Training on it's own may not change practice





Deaf/blind project

- Creating action plan with Sense trainer
- Observations of practice in services followed by feedback and team sessions
- Training for new staff
- Coaching of Southdown's Practice Development Trainers
- Creating an action plan to take work forward



Deaf/blind contd

Evaluation:

- Observation of practice and feedback (report) from Sense trainer
- Feedback from staff and managers
